Growing up, we had a lot of Christmas traditions: making Christmas cookies my brother always turned a reindeer into a 30 point buck, soup for Christmas Eve at my Aunt Coleen's, turning off the radio and singing Christmas carols. Perhaps a tradition I remember most wasn't actually a tradition at all. On Christmas Eve my family would go to my Grandma's house to celebrate with our extended family. My mom kept the whole group on a very set itinerary for when we would eat, when we would open presents, and what time our family needed to be leaving my grandma's house in order to still get good seats at Mass. We'd get there way too early and post up in "our" pew to safeguard our spot. Does this sound familiar to anyone?

Christmas Masses are always packed with relatives just along for the ride and teenagers forced to go by their grandparents. There are families there who have never brought their kids to Mass before that drag along their littles with toys and snacks. These visitors will likely take "your pew." They might even be talking to their neighbors, playing on their phone, or smacking their gum as they wait. So. Annoying. Right? **Wrong.**

It's easy to let our pride get the best of us and be irritated by visitors. But really, if we're too busy judging those in the pews around us we're missing the miracle that is happening right in front of us! The Eucharist is the miracle that happens at every Mass. But on Christmas, right underneath the greatest miracle of all, is the miracle that baby Jesus brings in those that have been away. Regardless of the reason why they've shown up to Mass and Baby Jesus in His sweetness, calls them to Him.

Now the challenge to us who do have a "favorite pew" is to do our best to make sure all who are in our church for the first time in a long time find a favorite pew too. Ask your friends and family who may have fallen away from the Church to come to Christmas Mass with you and your family! A lot of times, people are just looking for an invitation to return home.

All of us can be a welcoming face to others when they first step into our church. When you see another family struggling to keep littles quiet and engaged, smile at them! Give them a look that says "Hey, you're doing a good job and I totally get it." Then after Mass, make sure you say that to them before they leave! Just let them know you see them & you're happy they're there!

Now I'm not saying that getting to Mass early so you can have "good seats" is bad. But this year, just be at peace wherever it is that you end up in church. Be welcoming to all those around you. Offer a smile or a kind word to those who look like they'd rather be anywhere else.

The heavenly glow of the manger brings all people together. Sometimes we just need to take a small step back and let someone behind us get a little bit closer.
